POLAR-AREA DIAGRAM was invented by Florence Nightingale to dramatize the extent of needless deaths in British military hospitals during the Crimean War (1854-56) She called such diagrams "coxcombs" The area of each colored wedge, measured from the center, is proportional to the statistic being represented Blue wedges rep
