A total of 628 Victoria Crosses were awarded during the First World War: • 482 Victoria Crosses were awarded to UK and Ireland born recipients • 145 were awarded to servicemen who fought for Britain, but were born overseas • 1 person was awarded the Victoria Cross twice during the war Today the Government is paying tribute to the 145
